

Lies My Preacher Told Me: An Honest Look at the Old Testament will be our resource for this upcoming study. In it, Brent Strawn addresses ten common “lies” or mistruths about the Old Testament, from perceptions of God’s personality (the “angry Old Testament God”) to the relevance of the Old Testament for Christians. Discover why stories and laws written thousands of years ago, centuries before Christ, are enriching and indispensable for modern Christians. It is easy reading and good for group discussion. Bottom line, it will expand our thinking about some of the Old Testament’s content. See me for a copy of the book.

MISSION: June D. asks everyone to please remember the Connecticut Farms Food Pantry. While donations of non-perishable items can be accepted on Sunday mornings at 11:00AM, you are encouraged to support this ministry with a monthly monetary donation of \$4.00– a dollar a week can bring food to an empty pantry. Please mail it to Townley Church for distribution.



Additional mission project: We will be providing socks (and winter socks, gloves and hats in the fall) to the homeless. Those who wish to participate are asked to purchase these items and place them in

the outside container by the church office doors (near our 9/11 garden). The items will be given to Operation Warm Heart for distribution to the homeless. As of March 17, 2021 we had 14 personal care packs that were collected and delivered.

OPERATION WARM HEART: Is currently at full capacity with 16 people enrolled. Some additional ways to support the program would be to provide: cleaning supplies, garbage bags, laundry detergent, shelf safe milk, napkins, utensils, cereal packs, paper towels, toilet tissue, bar soap, liquid soap, snacks, individual cases of water, and cell phone minutes. MISSION COMMITTEE REPORT DATED APRIL 14, 2021: Mission received \$50 in the past month for our food pantry. CASA GIFT CARD DRIVE: Last year more than 1,500 children were placed in foster care in Essex County alone. These children, ranging in age from birth to 21 years old, were removed from their homes as a result of abuse, abandonment or neglect. CASA of Essex County (Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children) promotes the welfare of these children by providing a safety net of support, advocacy and mentorship. One of the areas where there is a great need of support is

amongst the youth ages 16+. At this age, they are often learning to live on their own.

To address this need, the Community Ministries Team is partnering with CASA Essex County to sponsor a gift card drive for foster youth in our local area. Gift cards would help fill the gaps to purchase necessities such as food, clothing and personal items.

REGARDING RULING ELDERS: A MONTHLY SERIES FOR SERVING FAITHFULLY

Leaders See by Rodger Nishioka – April 15, 2021

Each of us has a deep and profound need to be seen. That truth has never been more real to me than when a young white man shot and killed eight people, six of whom were Asian American women, in Atlanta recently. Those deaths brought into clear focus the dramatic rise of anti-Asian hatred across our country.

I am a fourth-generation Japanese American. I was born in Honolulu. My parents were both born in California. Their parents, my grandparents, were born either in California or in Hawaii. It was my great-grandparents who emigrated from Japan to the United States. We have been Americans for more than 150 years. Yet we, like many other Asian Americans, are viewed as “perpetual foreigners.”

It is one thing to live in a large metropolitan area with many other Asian American faces. It is another thing to live in the Midwest where there are fewer of us around. So it was particularly moving for me when I was walking to church in the week following the shootings in Atlanta, and I saw an older white woman, who was out walking her dog, approaching me. I remembered seeing her on earlier walks. As I came closer to her, I stepped off the sidewalk to walk in the street (COVID protocol). She smiled at me and nodded her head. I waved and said “good morning” and kept walking. Then I heard her say, “Excuse me.” I stopped and turned around. She was standing there with her dog and said, “I really don’t know you, but I see you walking. I just wanted to say that I am glad you’re here, and I am so sad about what happened in Atlanta, and I hope you’re okay.” And standing there on that bright, sunny morning, in this neighborhood near my church, I started to cry. “Thank you,” I said, when I could get the words out. “Thank you so much for your kindness.”

Each of us has a deep and profound need to be seen. Jesus did just that. Jesus saw people. He saw the leper and the paralyzed man. He saw the child and the widow. He saw the pharisee and the rich young ruler. He saw them all.

Leaders see. Leaders see people carefully, thoughtfully, and clearly, so much so that each person knows they have been seen. It is far too easy, especially in these days as the pace of our lives begins to pick up, for us to get too focused on our tasks, our errands, so that we do not see the people whom God has placed before us. People need to be seen. Good leaders see.

Elder in Charge Duties Checklist

- Arrive 45 minutes prior to Service.
- Make sure Sanctuary lights are on.
- Covid Protocol:
 - Ventilation (fan on/windows open)
 - Greeting Table set up hand sanitizer
- Ensure Communion Table is prepared on Communion Sunday
- Make sure bulletins are available in Narthex and placed on Greeting Table. (Check office if they are not there.)
- Light candles on the altar.
- Place extra envelopes on Greeting Table.
- Be positioned in Narthex 15 minutes prior to service.
- Invite congregants to sanitize hands as they arrive and take program from Greeting Table.
- Encourage visitors to take and complete a Visitor Card and return at end of service.
- CLOSE SANCTUARY DOORS once service has started. (Talking heard from the Narthex can be disruptive to the service.)
- Count attendees, including choir, organist, and pastor, and enter into book located in Narthex.
- Ensure Donation Box is in place at rear of the sanctuary.
- Be prepared to assist with issues as they arise during morning worship. (i.e.: quietly closing rear doors if there is chatter in the narthex or downstairs).
- Extinguish candles on altar at the conclusion of the service.
- Remove elements from Communion table and restore table.
- Turn off Sanctuary Lights; turn down heat, if needed. Shut off fan and close windows.
